## From Pastor Spronk's Desk



## **GRADUATION SEASON**

When you read this newsletter, our community will be in the middle of graduation season, the time of year that we celebrate our college, high school and eighth grade grads. We may even have our little ones put on the cap and gown to celebrate the end of preschool or kindergarten. For some of our graduates, the ceremony will mark a simple transition from one grade to another. But we know that for some, a graduation delineates a significant life change. There may be a move to a new community coming and perhaps a new school or a first job awaits. So, we mark these milestones. Photos with mom and dad, grandparents and friends are taken. For a moment in time, we look back on what was accomplished and look ahead to what could be.

What I am pondering this graduation season are words that were read by my son, Nick, in our recent Psalm 119 service "How can a young man keep his way pure? (v. 9)" This is the question that confronts all who are parents and all who teach our youth. What are the lessons we are imparting to the next generation? As they graduate to the next level or next season in their lives, how are our graduates to navigate a world that is broken and sinful? As the psalmist asks "how will a young person stay on the right path?"

The question is answered in the next line (and repeatedly through the 176 verses of this long Psalm) "How can a young man keep his way pure? By living according to your word (v. 9)." What is the best counsel and wisdom we can give a young person this graduation season? Follow the Bible. Read it. Meditate on it. Be transformed by it. In a world of confusion and chaos, the guidance of the Word of God is a lamp to all our feet. As our young people continue in their journeys, may the wisdom of the Scriptures guide us all: "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge (Proverbs 1:7)."



He plans to attend Northeast Iowa Community College to pursue a degree in Diesel Mechanics.



In his free time, he enjoys Shooting Sports. Nathan is the son of Marty & Crystal Roberts.




Leah Van Donselaar will graduate from Oskaloosa High School on May 21, 2023.



He and his wife manage the Children's home called Cuidad de Refugio which means City of Refuge. They have taken these young ones, who had no home, into their home. They give them a bed, cloth them, feed them and teach them about the love of Jesus. They live the Gospel each day.

Founded in 1964 in Redlands, CA., the Mexican Christian Children's Aid is a, 501(c)(3), Charitable Organization. It began when a group of Christian business people were moved to address the sharp contrast between the affluence in the U.S., and the abject poverty found just across our southern border in Mexico. We purchase and provide monthly bulk food deliveries and other assistance to local Christian organizations in the northern Baja region. We deliver the food donations primarily to organizations that sponsor Children's Homes and or operate periodic Feeding Programs to needy families. Along with the food, Spanish translation Bibles, Gospel Tracts, clothing and other items are generally a part of our deliveries. Our monthly runs consist of all volunteer drivers and riders who donate their vehicles full of fuel and literally everything needed to complete the mission each time we go. The MCCA does not own or rent a building, nor are there any paid staff.

The result is that 97% of all monetary donations goes directly to purchase food products.

Below is a Devotion that we felt has special significance to the ministry of the MCCA. It was written by Jody Duncan from the River Church, Redlands, CA. Wednesday, January 25, 2023

## Luke 14: 12 -14 "The Resurrection of the Righteous"

"Then Jesus said to his host, 'When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or sisters, your relatives, or your rich neighbors. If you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'

Biblical commentary suggests that the more proper translation is: 'Do not HABITUALLY invite your friends, your brothers or sisters ... 'There is, of course, nothing wrong with inviting relatives and friends to dinner. It is only wrong if you ONLY invite such people, while ignoring those in need.

The more important point Jesus makes here concerns inviting only those who will be able to repay the invitation. He is warning against an 'I'll scratch your back if you'll scratch mine' mentality. Rather, he wants us to extend our kindness and hospitality to those who will never be able to repay it.

One of the features of my childhood was that we often had unfortunate people living with us. My father, a teacher and vice principal, would identify a kid having trouble at home, and next thing we knew, that kid was staying with us for months. One such troubled kid remained in our lives, if only intermittently, for years. I had cousins with troubled home lives who lived with us off and on. One time, an entire family of six - relatives of my father's from Texas - lived with us for several months. Twelve people lived in a house that barely accommodated the six of us! No matter - my parents put a picnic table or two in the living room, and we all ate together and made the best of it.

My parents didn't necessarily talk about inviting the unfortunate into our home. They modeled it. Whatever inconveniences and discord these arrangements caused - and, oh boy, there were inconveniences and discord! - the problems were more than outweighed by the lesson they taught us.

Let us reach out to those who need of an invitation today, to those who will not ever repay us in this world. Jesus promises that through such an act, we will be repaid at the 'resurrection of the righteous.'










### **GREETINGS FROM OUR BELOVED FRIENDS** WARREN AND JUDY ARNETT
