From Pastor Kamp's Desk SYNOD 2023



As I reflect on Synod 2023, having watched the majority of it online, what strikes me is how much talking past each other seems to be taking place. Outside of a few rare occasions there is a lot of language, a lot of passion, a lot of emotions; but as to informing in regard to the decisions to be made it is Much Ado About Nothing.

I want to make sure I am not saying such speeches have no purpose. Multiple speakers described the significance of being heard and they certainly are not wrong. If we, as a denomination, desire to live together in covenant one of the most significant parts of maintaining covenant is listening to each other. After all, near the beginning of Exodus we read:

"The Israelites groaned in their slavery and cried out, and their cry for help because of their slavery went up to God. God heard their groaning and he remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac and with Jacob. So God looked on the Israelites and was concerned about them." (Exodus 2:23-25)

It was God actively listening unto the cries of His people which led to His mighty intervention and redemption of His people. It was their cries of pain and misery which caused Him to remember His covenant. Later, after the Red Sea, the Israelites almost immediately begin to complain about food and drink wishing they had never been saved. God responds by providing Manna, Quail, and Rocks. Later still, as Moses is up on the mountain confirming the covenant with the Ten Commandments, God sees and hears Israel's worship of the golden calf as they attribute their salvation to a false idol. These actions cause God to "burn with anger" against the Israelites until Moses intercedes for them.

Through the whole of Exodus God is actively listening unto His people with whom He keeps covenant. That listening leads to Israel's salvation, and later it will lead to their punishment. God's listening will lead to Israel's care, and it will also lead to mercy. In the case of the golden calf, it leads to anger that stems from a blatant betrayal. But thanks to the covenant, it never leads to silence or ignoring. The book of Exodus ends triumphantly with the glory of God filling the tabernacle so that God might dwell with His people.

We, in the CRCNA, as a denomination have covenanted to dwell together in a sense. A critical aspect in maintaining that life together is listening to one another. I write this as someone who desperately desires to have debate end, and more than just one. I tire of the same points, arguments, and motions being brought up over and over again. As I reflect on this page, I wonder if I have become so tired by debate that I have allowed myself to tire of listening. That though this might be the same point, it is a new person who deserves to be heard within the community. Perhaps not all on the floor of Synod, but it should be somewhere in our church. Perhaps the fact that so many feel desperate to speak at Synod comes from the reality that they don't feel heard anywhere else.

Such thoughts cause me to question how much I listen regarding the life of the CRCNA besides Synod. How many articles written by people involved in our denomination ministries do I read? How many editorial points raised do I reflect upon? How many times have I opened up the prayer guides provided by our denomination and prayed together with the church? Do I live and listen to the CRCNA beside Synod?

I clearly know the reasons why I do not wish too. Though as I reflect on the Exodus, I am convicted of its necessity to live in covenant together. Even though listening leads frequently to God's frustration and anger with His people, it was also the path by which God not only saved His people but dwelt with them.

I feel convinced if salvation and living together is the goal of our denominational decisions, then listening is the road we must walk together. It may be a slow walk filled with pains, frustrations and anger; and I pray that it won't be for us 40 years of waking in the wilderness only to end exactly where we started as Israel experienced. But even if it is so, after all those years of wandering together we have loved and listened; if we have kept faith and covenant together it certainly will not be Much Ado About Nothing.



CAMPUS LIFE HIGH SCHOOL





Founded in 1964 in Redlands, CA., Mexican Christian Children's Aid is a, 501(c)(3), Charitable Organization. It began when a group of Christian business people were moved to address the sharp contrast between the affluence in the U.S., and the abject poverty found just across our southern border in Mexico. We purchase and provide monthly bulk food deliveries and other assistance to local Christian organizations in the northern Baja region. We deliver the food donations primarily to organizations that sponsor Children's Homes and or operate periodic Feeding Programs to needy families. Along with the food, Spanish translation Bibles, Gospel Tracts, and other items are generally a part of our deliveries. Our monthly runs consist of all volunteer drivers and riders who donate their vehicles full of fuel and literally everything needed to complete the mission each time we go. The MCCA does not own or rent a building, nor are there any paid staff.

The result is that 100% of all monetary donations goes directly to purchase food products.
