ORGAN UPDATE FROM THE COUNCIL:

- Repair #1: An Allen Organ repairman discovered a bad photocell in one of the expression pedals. Replacing the photocell corrected the volume/expression on certain stops. Some other adjustments were also made to improve the overall sound of the organ. These repairs were completed a few weeks ago. An additional defect in one of the tone generator boards was also found and could be replaced.
- Repair #2: The Council approved replacing the tone generator board on our current organ. This replacement will also be completed.
- Thanks: The Council would like to thank the Organ Committee for their efforts put forth in the research, proposal, pledge fundraiser, and repairing our current organ as best possible.
- Pledges: All pledges for a new organ are now released as the Council has decided to no longer pursue replacing the current organ. We want to thank the congregation for their prayers and to those who pledged toward a new organ.
