

God Bless Our Native Land




God bless our native land, Where sleep our kindred dead, Let peace at thy command Above their graves be shed.

From Pastor Kamp's Desk

A NEW FOUNDATION



The book of Ezra is one that takes place at a time in Israel's history which is rarely studied. The book recounts some of the challenges the Jewish people faced as they return from Babylonian exile to restore and refill the Promised Land. Ezra chapter three speaks about the people's reaction when the foundation for the new Temple was laid since Solomon's was destroyed by Babylonians:

"And all the people gave a great shout of praise to the LORD, because the foundation of the house of the LORD was laid. But many of the older priests and Levites and family heads, who had seen the former temple, wept aloud when they saw the foundation of this temple being laid, while many others shouted for joy."

(Ezra 3:11-12)

While reading through this story I could not help but think of the denominational challenges the CRCNA has been facing these past years. The challenges also, could largely be summarized with the question, "What is our foundation?". What is the foundation of the CRCNA in the year 2024?

Now I am a lifelong member of the CRC, I grew up in a Dutch Christian home, and I attended a private Christian school. I spent 5 years in Cadets building pinewood derby cars and camping. I grew up playing Biddy Basketball and church league sports. I spent a week in UCLA with kids across the continent at the Youth Unlimited Conference for high schoolers. Every Wednesday night I had limited homework because it was a church night filled with meals, movies, songs, and games. My church life, family life, and school life were so closely intertwined that I didn't know where one ended and the other began. It was a very encapsulating and exclusive community.

This was the foundation of the CRC and I am greatly appreciative of having had the opportunity to grow up walking upon it. I understand those who have witnessed the changes taking place within the denomination and mourn that the old foundation of the Dutch community seems to be slipping away.

A new foundation is being built for a new church community. A church that includes many people without a Dutch heritage who know nothing of the life I described; a church with diverse cultures such as Korean, Hispanic, and Native American. The old foundation is gone, and rightly so, for today's church. Now it is time to build a new one. What will that foundation be? What will the next generation reflect back on when they're in their forties trying to write a Pastor's Page?

That is why this past years Synod was so important as many faithful pastors and parishioners throughout the U.S. and Canada worked to establish our Creeds and Confessions as the CRCNA's foundation. This year's Synod was the culmination of many years of prayer and effort to re-establish us once more upon the biblical truths expressed through our Creeds and Confessions; to re-build our church once more upon this foundation.

And as we did so, many celebrated and praised God for His faithfulness unto His church; while at the same time those who remembered the former CRCNA mourned. "No one could distinguish the sound of shouts of joy from the sound of weeping, because the people made so much noise." (Ezra 3:13) The book of Ezra does not reprimand those who wept at the laying of a new foundation, it acknowledges their presence and perspective as legitimate noise as the new Temple is being built.

And so let allow those who mourn their voice and presence amongst us as we continue the project of re-building this denomination which we all love upon that which first defined it – our Creeds and Confessions.

And let us ask, how can we at First CRC be faithful to our denomination's direction in the building upon our Creeds and Confessions?




God's Word Transforms Lives and Communities



The MCCA, from it's beginning 60 years ago, has been a ministry that God has richly blessed with many amazing people. People who got involved and served faithfully in the name of Jesus. People who have supported with faithful and generous donations, drivers with trucks, riders with strong backs to load and deliver the food. The planning, organization and execution of the monthly mexico deliveries is impressive. An all volunteer army of genuine compassion.

Having said that, Judy Arnett was nonetheless a very special and noteworthy person with regard to the MCCA organization. Her hard work and influence was a profound example to all of us who were blessed to know her and work alongside her. She served the Lord through the MCCA ministry for 20 years.

Judy was deeply focused on providing for the needs of orphaned and abandoned children in Baja Mexico. She was tireless. Most of her days each month were spent making sure the next Mexico run was well organized. Attending to the details of sending 16 heavy duty pickup trucks, full of thousands of pounds of bulk food, along with volunteers, with specific assignments of where to deliver the food, along with the specific quantities was, and is still, a monumental task.

Warren Arnett, Judy's husband, served along side her. He and Judy, often accompanied by their son's, drove their truck loaded with food on the trips for many years. Warren and Judy served on the Board of Directors. Warren served as the President of the Board for two years. Warren continues to serve as our Driver Coordinator, assigning the routes.

The Bible teaches us that our hearts of stone are transformed to hearts of flesh when we surrender our lives to Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Judy Arnett was an example of that. She never drew attention to herself. She quietly and humbly took care of what was needed. In Chapter 5 of Galatians the fruits of the Spirit are listed; Love, Joy Peace, Patience, Gentleness, Goodness, Faith. In Christ, Judy was full of the fruits of the Spirit of God. May her life and memory be an enduring example to us all of how to live our lives.

Founded in 1964 in Redlands, CA., Mexican Christian Children's Aid is a, 501(c)(3), Charitable Organization. It began when a group of Christian business people were moved to address the sharp contrast between the affluence in the U.S., and the abject poverty found just across our southern border in Mexico. We purchase and provide monthly bulk food deliveries and other assistance to local Christian organizations in the northern Baja region. We deliver the food donations primarily to organizations that sponsor Children's Homes and or operate periodic Feeding Programs to needy families. Along with the food, Spanish translation Bibles, Gospel Tracts, and other items are generally a part of our deliveries. Our monthly runs consist of all volunteer drivers and riders who donate their vehicles full of fuel and literally everything needed to complete the mission each time we go. The MCCA does not own or rent a building, nor are there any paid staff.

The result is that 100% of all monetary donations goes directly to purchase food products.

Changes to the Officers of MCCA

Tom Rasmussen has stepped down as MCCA's Treasurer due to some personal reasons. Tom continues to be a member of the Board. Steve Diaz has stepped into the role of Treasurer. Stepping into the Vice President role left vacant by Steve is Don Dresner. Both will serve in that role for the remainder of the calendar year.

We get to do this.

On January 29, 1964, a group of men met at Bethany Reformed Church in Redlands, CA for the first time with the sole mission to gather support for the Rose Park Orphanage. At this meeting were Don Van Wieren, Scott Coverdale, Jerry Hamill, and Mike Stoel. Alongside Ray Zimmer, they put together a fundraiser, a chicken BBQ dinner that took place on July 25, 1964. Between 700-1000 folks showed up and they raised over \$1000... they were thrilled.

MCCA, as an entity Itself, officially turns 60 this year. Only God could have came up and planned and prepared the road ahead. Every single member, somehow somewhere heard God calling to them, and every single one of us accepted that call. We each have a

unique story to tell.


