From Pastor Spronk's Desk



CONFESSIONAL RENEWAL

As we turn to 2025, our church and our denomination are entering into transitional times. After the decisions of Synods 2022, 2023 and 2024, there is a marked sense that the CRC is seeking to turn back to its confessional roots. And there is slowly building a wealth of excellent resources that are coming not top-down from denominational offices but rising up from a younger generation of CRC pastors and lay people calling us to greater confessional identity and loyalty.

In this space before I have promoted *The Abide Project* and their associated writings which can be found at abideproject.org. Furthermore, there are many excellent podcasts that are CRC-related currently being produced with new episodes on a weekly basis. *Reformed Podmatics* is hosted by Pastors Mark VanDyke and Zac Dewey of Almond Valley CRC, in Ripon, CA and they tackle contemporary issues facing the Reformed churches. *Three Forms Podcast*, by Pastors Lloyd Hemstreet and Tyler Wagenmaker of Western Michigan, walks through the teachings of the Heidelberg Catechism, Belgic Confession and Canons of Dort. Additionally, *The Messy Reformation*, by Pastor Jason Ruis and Deacon Willy Krahnke, has continued to have episodes that explore issues of discipleship and evangelism in the CRC. And there are podcasts related to the CRC from folks in the wider Reformed church like the *Heidelcast*, *Mortification of Spin*, and the *White Horse Inn*. I'd encourage you to listen to these podcasts from these leaders who are seeking renewal, not just in the CRC, but in the wider Church in North America.

Finally, our congregation will focus on preaching through the Heidelberg Catechism in 2025. Our preaching ministry will focus weekly on the Lord's Days and we are encouraging our families to use the *Comforting Hearts, Teaching Minds* devotional by Starr Meade. Think of this year as a Year of Jubilee as we join with this movement of the Spirit in declaring with the faithful: "That I am not my own, but belong — body and soul, in life and in death — to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ." May our Lord use this year to comfort our hearts and to teach our minds.

Dear Friends at First CRC.

Greetings in the name of Jesus, our Lord and Savior. We pray that this letter finds you and your church family well and wrapped in Christ's Love.

Lake View Camp was blessed with a great summer, and we continue to praise God for all that we were able to accomplish through His wonderworking power. We give Him thanks and praise for a great summer staff, for all of the campers who attended this summer, and for all of the volunteers who came out to give of their time and talents. We also praise God for our special partnerships with churches like you who help us bring the good news of God's love, salvation, and grace to His children. Together with you, we will continue to answer the daily call to put our hope in Jesus and help those around us to do the same.

This summer was full of God's grace and goodness. With many of our camps at full capacity, we were able to see hundreds of beautiful faces, both familiar and new, praising, worshiping and learning about our Good Father. We held 25 camps this summer and had just under 1,000 campers. The summer included several overnight camps for elementary, middle school, and high school campers, three day camps for elementary-aged kids, and three weekend "Grand Camps" for grandparents and their grandkids. We also held eight Angel Tree camps for at-risk youth in elementary, middle school, and high school. In addition, we held a camp specifically for elementary-aged children who are a part of the Congolese refugee community in the Des Moines area. We are excited to participate in God's global heart by welcoming the nations to experiencing the Gospel of Jesus at camp. God's hand was upon us guiding us, correcting us, providing for us, and holding us up — which is exactly what we learned at camp this summer!

This past summer's theme focused on who God is as the Great I AM and what He does for us. 

"When I was a Buddhist, I never had a happy mind. I would always feel an emptiness inside." Hemalatha is a 65-year-old grandmother in central Sri Lanka. About 30 years ago, she discovered the way to fill that void when she and her husband became Christians. She notes, "When we accepted Him, we found peace and happiness."

Ever since, Hemalatha and her husband have faithfully attended a church about four miles from their home. Over the years, her faith has grown deep roots through studying God's Word. Recently, she attended training to become a Bible League Bible study leader.

"My dream is to pass on to my neighbors what I have learned and received," she gently responds. Browsing through the booklet on her lap, Hemalatha adds, "We can take these books and the Bibles and use them to reach out to others. I joined this training because I want to be strong in and through the Word of God. It will help


me do personal evangelism and explain the Gospel to the people I meet."

Though Hemalatha has already been sharing the Gospel with her neighbors, she knows Bible League's Bible studies will help her reach even more people in her village. 
The Peace of God

Dear Friends and Family,

We are a family that prays. We are a people who are called to pray. We are able to talk with God and have joyful hope. We pray to connect with our Heavenly Father. Prayers can be praises and gratitude, while others are full of lamenting. Either way, we are to pray. Prayer is faith. Our Heavenly Father will answer those prayers. Staying connected with God through prayer is important to us, and is an integral part of our ministry. We have a devotional every Monday morning with prayer time to start our work week. As we go to visit a farmers field, our agronomist Darwin also takes time to pray with them.

At the end of the technical visit in October, Darwin prayed with farmers Cruz and Max at their workplace, their corn field. He asked for any specific prayer requests. Expecting a common prayer for the crops, he was surprised when farmer Cruz told him his daughter had an accident and broke her arm, she was hospitalized. When they finished praying, farmer Max gave a testimony, that he had a very strong pain in his knee, but the pain has gone and he walks better since the prayer during their previous technical visit! At the publishing of this prayer letter, Cruz's daughter is out of the hospital and recovering from her accident.

We are learning how much the farmers enjoy the prayer time, and when it doesn't happen, they can miss it! In another visit, Darwin visited farmer Jacinto in his home. Jacinto asked Darwin why they had not prayed together during the first planting cycle this year. Before the visit was over, he reminded Darwin again before he left his street from afar. Darwin



mentioned he was left speechless and pondering about that moment. He never thought someone was going to remind him that he hadn't prayed in their field! He took this as a personal challenge and motivated himself not to neglect opportunities to pray with farmers, regardless of the circumstances he found himself in. He said he will always make time to dedicate his work to God through prayer!

I (Jesse) have a memory I cherish and think of often. In April's letter we introduced you to Karla. A business women with a store who employs ten young women. Every Monday she also has a Bible devotional time with her employees. As I was leaving after a morning training session, I was blessed to see her employees gather around her in a circle, as she was sitting in a chair by the cash register. She led a meeting and prayer for a big event they were going to have! This is a reminder of the importance of God's blessings in our work!

We have been praying for a ministry farm for the last four years. We found the land, and this month we have finished a land survey to start the purchasing procedure! As we look back at our second year at Geneva, we are so grateful for the people God brought together to think deeply about the intersection of the learning and work that we do and the faith that we live out. Over the past year, we have offered diverse learning experiences to students, faculty, staff, and community including lectures, concerts, panels, meals, film nights, trips, and book clubs. Literally hundreds of people have engaged with a Geneva event in the past year, and we are eager to see the transformative work that God will do in the upcoming year.

In this report you'll see some highlights from the year, how we are doing financially, and ways for you to get involved in and give to the work of Geneva. We ask that you take time to pray for God's continued provision for Geneva, and consider giving a year-end gift to help us finish strong to meet our financial goals. 

The first stop on the Miracle Ranch run, also known as Rancho Milagro, is **Door of Faith**. It is an Orphanage that has been in operation for many years and the MCCA has been making monthly food deliveries there for many years as well. Back in 1985 a woman from Redlands, Ann Vander Zee, towed a small trailer across the border and drove to Door of Faith. She parked it on the property and volunteered there, for a period of time, living out of that little trailer. Ann was Liz DeWitt's Aunt. Liz would go on to marry Richard DeWitt, who still drives his heavy duty pickup truck into Mexico each month on the MCCA runs.



Door of Faith is located in the La Mision district of Baja, about 50 miles south of the border and not far from the coast. It sits on a large piece of property, nestled among dozens of small farms near a river bed. It is one of the larger children's homes we deliver food and Bibles to. Currently they care for about 80 children of all age groups. It is very well organized and focused on providing a family environment where physical, mental, and especially spiritual health are emphasized. An excerpt from their mission statement reads as follows, "The very reason we are here is to serve our Lord Jesus Christ through serving and seeking Him; our ultimate goal here is to raise responsible Christian adults." Prayer, Worship, Bible and healthy food are the order of the day at Door of Faith.

Founded in 1964 in Redlands, CA., Mexican Christian Children's Aid is a, 501(c)(3), Charitable Organization. It began when a group of Christian business people were moved to address the sharp contrast between the affluence in the U.S., and the abject poverty found just across our southern border in Mexico. We purchase and provide monthly bulk food deliveries and other assistance to local Christian organizations in the northern Baja region. We deliver the food donations primarily to organizations that sponsor Children's Homes and or operate periodic Feeding Programs to needy families. Along with the food, Spanish translation Bibles, Gospel Tracts, and other items are generally a part of our deliveries. Our monthly runs consist of all volunteer drivers and riders who donate their vehicles full of fuel and literally everything needed to complete the mission each time we go. The MCCA does not own or rent a building, nor are there any paid staff.

100% of all monetary donations go directly to purchase food products for needy children and their caregivers.

Since the early 60s, **Door of Faith** has carried out the mission of caring for children at risk in Baja California. We sit on over 100 acres about one hour south of Tijuana, in the small town of La Mision. Our large and colorful campus is more of a small town than an institution. We have 8 homes/dorms around the property for our many children, interspersed with support buildings and staff housing. We have everything a small town might: Medical clinic, classrooms, a library, a barbershop, bakery, and many other buildings to support the work here.

There have been many challenges over the years but God has kept his hand on the work here and carried the home for many decades. We are so thankful to MCCA and the many organizations and individuals that continue to make this work possible.

An organization is only as good as its leaders. In late June our long-term Mexican Director passed away. This turned into a very difficult transition, but we are so excited about the changes since then. We are proud to introduce our new Director: Diego Barajas. Diego has a long history here as he was raised at Door of Faith from a very young age. While attending Law School he married his wonderful wife and they went on to have two children. Diego and his family are excited about being back here, and working with the whole team to provide the best home possible to the many children in our care. Like Diego, our new assistant director, many of our "house parents" were raised here at Door of Faith as well. They grew up learning how to give back, and they're now putting that upbringing into action.

Our goal has always been to bring children from very difficult backgrounds through healing. We want to raise them up to be healthy, productive members of society. It's SO great when we see the healing, and the results of all the effort. We couldn't do this without people like you praying for us and helping in so many areas.

"We have different gifts, according to the grace given to us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let let him use it in proportion to his faith. If it is




Dear First Christian Reformed Church,


