From Pastor Spronk's Desk



LOOKING TOWARD SYNOD 2025

The CRC 2025 Synod will convene at Redeemer University in Ancaster, Ontario, Canada from June 13-19. I (Pastor Jon) have been delegated along with another pastor and 2 Elder's from Classis Central Plains. This will be my 4th Synod, though it's my first one since 2016. As I have talked about in this space before, the Synods of 2022-24 have been a series of important gatherings for the CRC as we solidified what we believe about the topic of sexuality in the face of the rapidly changing societal views.

Synod 2022 passed the Human Sexuality Report, Synod 2023 confirmed it and Synod 2024 gave instructions on how non-compliant churches and office-bearers (pastors, elders, deacons) would be disciplined going forward. In the aftermath of Synod 2024, there have been approximately 40 churches and 60 pastors (active and retired) that are seeking disaffiliation with the CRC (denominationally, we have about 1000 churches and 1000 pastors and commissioned pastors). I grieve that these pastors and churches are leaving, but I also know that if the Synods had gone the other way the loss in our denomination would have been catastrophic. For example, the Reformed Church in America (RCA) has lost approximately 75% of their churches and members in the last 5 years (and most of their churches locally in Central Iowa) over the issues of sexuality.

I suspect Synod 2025 to be a bit quieter Synod. There are still lingering questions about how we implement confessional faithfulness at our denominational college, Calvin University, but I have been encouraged by recent reports from CU's administration. Furthermore, there will be discussions on the CRC's relationship with the RCA (again the remnant RCA is a much different denomination today).

Synod 2025 will also have reports from Task Forces on Virtual Church and on Assisted Suicide, issues that will certainly impact the denomination going forward. Moreover, Synod will have a variety of overtures and requests from its Classes and Councils. If you are interested in reading the full agenda it is now online at www.crcna.org/synodresources (be warned, it is 431 pages!).

Friends, as May and June approach, please pray for me and the other delegates. The days of Synod are always full, busy, and wearing. Please pray for our denomination as we seek to fulfill our mandate as a Christ-Centered Church.



Anna De Bruin will graduate from North Mahaska High School on May 18, 2025.


She plans to attend Iowa State University for Business/Accounting.

Erica was involved in Soccer, Cross-Country, FFA and the Yearbook while she was in high school.



Bethany is the daughter of Jeremy & Kristen Van Donselaar.






2025 College Graduates

Dave Gritters accepts New Life pastoral call

The New Life Council is delighted to announce that Dave Gritters has accepted the call to be the commissioned pastor for New Life Prison Church.

Dave and his wife, Cindy, have been part of New Life since its beginning, going into Newton Correctional Facility to bring music to worship services. Dave has also served as an elder on the New Life Council. Since Rick and Rose Admiraal left Pella in December 2023, Dave and Cindy have taken on leadership roles. Dave has taken charge of weekly worship while Cindy, who often accompanies him, has undertaken administrative work.

Dave and Cindy are lifelong residents of Pella and lifelong members of the Christian Reformed Church, of which New Life is an organized congregation. Dave and Cindy hold their "outside membership" at Calvary CRC of Pella, where Cindy is also on staff as the worship coordinator. The Gritters have been involved in prison

ministry for many years. Beyond New Life, they served as small group and worship leaders with the Interchange Freedom Initiative (IFI) before that program ended; they also served with Crossroads Fellowship for several years.

Dave has a true heart for serving God. He is a workplace chaplain at two local manufacturing companies. In 2025, he completed his theological education with the Coram Deo Association of Churches, completing the CRC commissioned pastor program after four years of study. Dave and Cindy have a heart for the incarcerated. They love bringing God's word to them and the joy of worshipping our God with our brothers in Christ in Newton.

The New Life Council praises God that Dave was willing to accept our call



to leadership! We pray this ministry may continue and thrive as we bring worship to Newton Correctional Facility each week.

Dave and Cindy have three adult children living in Denver, Oklahoma City, and Pella. They have four grandchildren, whom they love watching grow. The Gritters also love the outdoors and can often be found enjoying a beautiful summer sunset from their boat on the lake, taking a walk, or simply enjoying their backyard.



Glenda Vander Leest (Governing Elder)

I have been part of the New Life community since its very beginning, serving on the launch team for six years when we were feeling our way into something very new to us. This opportunity came at a time when my children were grown and I was looking for a way to serve God and find more purpose for my life. I remember well the first time I went into the prison! I was definitely out of my comfort zone, but God opened my eyes to my narrowmindedness, and I was so blessed by our reception

in the prison. Through the years, my husband, Dwight, and I have been active in going into the prison and have been involved in Brothers in Blue programs. I have been so blessed and privileged to be part of this organization that brings God's word into this place where many are searching for life change.

Keith Van Gent (Administrative Deacon & Treasurer)

I was raised on a farm near Otley, Iowa. I attended the Pella school system and graduated from Pella High School in 1977. I married Jeannetta (Netta) Van Gent in 1989, and we have three children. Kurtis is married to Brittny; they live in Erie, Colorado, and have two children: Korey (age five) and Adalyn (three). Kris is married to Dana. They own Iowa Bike Co. in Pella, and Dana is also an attorney at Kreykes Law Office. They have a three-year-old son, Porter, and another on the way who will arrive in July. Our daughter, Emily, is the youngest. She worked at Many Hands for Haiti for five years and currently works at Pella Corp.

Netta does interior design. She loves designing and decorating homes. I worked for Hy-Vee for 41 years and retired in 2017. We've lived in seven different Iowa towns, moving around with Hy-Vee. We now split our time between

Iowa and Florida.



I was involved with the M2 Program at the Sioux Falls State Prison for several years before we moved back to Pella. As soon as I met Rick Admiraal at the bike shop, I knew I wanted to spend some of my retirement volunteering with New Life Prison Church.

Linda Zuidema (Administrative Deacon)

My husband was the first to be involved in prison ministry at Newton Correctional Facility. He enjoyed the weekly Tuesday Bible studies and the Brothers in Blue program, which involved three days of intense Bible study and confronting the prisoners with the living Jesus. He always encouraged me to go to the Bible studies with him. I was concerned about the barbed wires and locked doors. And, of course, the prisoners themselves. How would I be received? But I found a place full of the Holy Spirit,



joyful singing, and earnest Bible study. COVID severely curtailed the programs. It was a difficult time. But God is faithful, and the inside church prevailed in their hearts and lives. We are still quite limited in some ways we do not understand, but we still see lives changing and faith growing!

Marv Goodyk (Administrative Deacon)

I have been involved in prison ministry since November 1999. My first involvement was with the

IFI program, mentoring eight Class 3 inmates from the beginning until their graduation. I also assisted in teaching computer classes. Then my wife joined me, and we taught various classes, including listening/communication skills, basic math, and Bible studies. We also mentored a few before and after release. I have been involved with New Life since its beginning. I have led Bible studies and worship services at various times at both Newton Correctional Facility and the Correctional Release Center. I have also served as a spiritual director for Brothers in Blue, which has allowed me to serve in other facilities in Iowa and South Dakota.

What I love about the ministry is being able to worship with the men. I always come away blessed. We have also gotten to know several of the men personally and shared friendships with them

after their release. One of the original eight men I mentored in IFI now lives in Nebraska (near Sioux City), and he came to help us move into our new home a few weeks ago. He is involved in missions and prison ministry. What a joy to see men turn their lives around and become workers in the Kingdom. It is a privilege to be used by God in this way.



Pastor Sheldon Starkenburg (Governing Elder)

I have served as Calvary's minister of congregational life and outreach since 1999. I grew up in South Dakota and graduated from Dordt University and Calvin Seminary. In 2022, I retired and now spend most of my time doing pastoral care, particularly among those who have a bit more life experience. I consider it a privilege

to walk with our members through times of joy and loss, and I enjoy finding ways to share God's love with those in the Pella community.

I have two daughters: Regina, who is the program director at Wildwood Hills Ranch, and Ramona, who still lives at home because of her special needs. I enjoy fishing and traveling, especially to the mountains.



Max Killoren (Governing Elder)

What I love about prison ministry is that God has given me a chance to be part of His plan to help those who are

struggling with life, seeking a New Life. I have been involved with Bible studies and Brothers in Blues weekends. When we were shut out of the prison for a time, God kept on with the study groups. That's when I realized God might want me to serve, but He does not need me to serve.

It's my understanding that this precedent was set as it was a way to safeguard against a human centered agenda being set. The only agenda I plan on pushing is keeping our Christ-centered approach to ministry work with a focus on

recruiting the next wave of volunteers (preferably ones with young backs) to help lighten the load and work towards expanding our faithful Donor base.

What hasn't changed is that my favorite part of the month is circling up with 40-50 of my brothers and sisters, many of us would have probably never met, to pray together for traveling mercies, praying for a chance to see God at work, thankful for the opportunity to be His hands, His feet. Thankful to be called by our father to share the love of Jesus with "the least of these." In fact, those kids bless us more than we could ever possibly bless them...

Charles Shinski, whom has taken on the role of Vice President starting this year, still calls me El Presidente. 

Founded in 1964 in Redlands, CA., the Mexican Christian Children's Aid is a 501(c)(3). Charitable Organization. It began when a group of Christian business people were moved to address the sharp contrast between the affluence in the U.S., and the abject poverty found just across our southern border in Mexico. We purchase and provide monthly bulk food delivenes and other assistance to local Christian organizations in the northern Baja region. We deliver the food donations primarily to organizations that sponsor Children's Homes and or operate periodic Feeding Programs to needy families. Along with the food. Spanish translation Bibles. Gospel Tracts, clothing and other items are generally a part of our deliveries. Our monthly runs consist of all volunteer drivers and index who donate their vehicles full of fuel and literally everything needed to complete the mission each time weign. The MCCA does not own or rent a building, not are there any paid staff. Accounting services and other administrative costs are all paid with cash back rewards when we buy our food with Credit Cards in Mexico.

The result is that 100% of all monetary donations goes directly to purchase food products.



From a distance, today's Tijuana cityscape is impressive.

Zoom in a little closer and you see a different story.

Crossing the border into Tijuana via the San Ysidro or Otay Mesa portals, you will encounter a sprawling metropolis of buildings, vehicles and millions of people on the move. TJ has become a relatively modern city with high rise structures, shopping areas, and food establishments. Yet, if you turn off the main roads you will often see a different picture. Many of the people in the area remain in the grip of poverty and suffer deplorable living conditions. The picture on the right is only a mile or two from our border.

It has been reported that there are more than 300 Orphanages in Baja California alone. The organizations we bring food to, report to us that support from the Mexican government is minimal at best or not at all. At the same time, the cost of food in Mexico has risen greatly, just as it has in the U.S. Many of the people who serve in Mexico and care for orphaned and or needy children are struggling to afford the daily need for food. On the TJ run, just a few miles from where we purchase food and load the trucks for our monthly MCCA deliveries, is a destination we call Nicki's Place. Nicki and her husband have a feeding ministry in their neighborhood that the MCCA has been supporting with bulk food donations for many years. Children and family members from these poor neighborhoods are fed a couple times a week. Nicki also hands out gospel tracks in Spanish that we provide for her. The tracks inform the people about the love of Jesus Christ and the message of Salvation through Him. They prepare and feed large numbers of needy kids and families each week. Nicki and Elezar are full of the love of Christ. Like Jesus did when He walked among us, they humbly serve, without fanfare, in the trenches of hunger and poverty where children and families live. Beautiful.
