#### From Pastor Spronk's Desk

### THE ONCE AND FUTURE CRC

For CRC Synod 2025 there are several places to hear what Synod did including CRC News (google search: CRC News), the *Banner* and conversations that I have had with the congregation by the time this newsletter is printed.

However, in this reflection, I want to focus on one aspect of the future of our denomination. The battles of the past few years, specifically over sexuality, seem to be over. We have made our positions on Biblical sexuality known, have demonstrated that they are faithful to the Bible and in alignment with our Creeds and Confessions and with the Church Universal. Churches and Pastors who could not stand with those decisions have begun to exit the CRC (30 churches and around 100 active and retired pastors).

In the aftermath of these discussions, we need to look ahead. We have been so inwardly focused in the last decade that now is the time to look outward. We have a faith that is needed in the world and a Reformed witness that others need to hear. Many of us were challenged at Synod 2025 with the realities of church planting in our denomination. Frankly, the number of members and churches in the CRC has been in decline since 1995 and the trends are only accelerating.

With that numerical decline there has been a decrease in CRC Ministry Shares given to our denominational agencies and the financial realities are that denominational funding is getting cut. Currently, the biggest impact is to Resonate (the combined Home and World Missions agency of the CRC). A budget shortfall of \$4 million in the next year has meant that Resonate is changing its church planting model. No longer is Resonate going to be able to give funds/grants to new church plants. Those church plants or church planters are going to have to rely directly on local churches or Classis (regional church associations) for financial support.

Now some of our local churches and Classes are very active in the church planting movement. Many, including us in Classis Central Plains, are not. But things are starting to happen. Pastor Erik has started making connections with a network of CRC Hispanic church planters in Houston that are need in financial support and could perhaps help our Classis think about Hispanic ministry in Central Iowa. I (Pastor Jon) have connected with some Iowa Chinese and Korean churches that are looking to further plant in our state. Others in Classis are having discussions about where next in the region of Central Iowa do we need CRC churches.

My challenge to us is to prayerfully consider what God desires for the mission of church planting now. My prayer is that God would send more workers and more resources for the harvest. How can First CRC Oskaloosa participate in this Great Commission of our Lord? What opportunities are there in our state, our region and beyond that we can support with our help and our treasure? May we in a generation, say in 2050, look back and see how the seeds of new churches were started in our times. To God be the Glory.

When Koya was 19 years old, she began to experience the loss of using her lower legs. Life in the desert region of northern Kenya can be brutal for someone with limited mobility. In her village of Korr, the harsh climate makes it difficult to acquire basic necessities like food and water.



She learned to move around by bending from the waist and crawling with knees on the ground. When one of our partners heard of Koya's situation, he rented a vehicle, hired a driver, and set off across 122 miles through sand and areas of unrest to reach her. Koya was lifted out of the dirt and given a Mobility Cart. She had crawled on the ground for 47 years, and this was the first mobility device Koya had ever received.

Koya and her family are so happy! The gift of mobility truly restores dignity, renews hope, and changes lives... just like Koya's.

MCCA's Latest Adventure: Overcoming Borders to Bless Baja's Children An Article by Chris Glaze, MCCA Board member, and Monthly Trip Team member The trip referenced below took place on Saturday, March 3rd, 2025

Dear MCCA Family,

Our recent mission to feed orphans in Baja California was a testament to God's faithfulness, even when obstacles arise. This trip, our team of volunteers faced a tougher-than-usual Mexican border crossing. All 10 lanes were being filmed, with at least 3 agents per lane scrutinizing every vehicle. Our truck's bed was thoroughly searched - toolbox, bags, and even two boxes of men's diapers, which earned us some amused glances from the agents! We were cleared to proceed, but our second truck, carrying Spanish translated Bibles on the back seat, wasn't as fortunate. It was sent to the duty area for evaluation, requiring forms, a two hour wait, and a \$250 duty payment.

Despite the delay, our spirits stayed high. At the market, we purchased beans, rice, oats, powdered milk, and more - all sourced locally in Mexico to avoid border duties. Our 14 volunteer-driven trucks delivered these supplies to over 50 children's homes and feeding programs across Tijuana, Ensenada, and Tecate. The setback only made the day's joy sweeter as we shared the Bibles, and the Gospel with the children. Their smiles and the gratitude of the childcare centers reminded us why we press on.

Heading into Mexico at about 7:00 am usually involves a brief stop where a Mexican Border Agent takes a quick look into the truck bed and cab. A minute or two and we are on our way. On May 3, 2025 one of our trucks was detained for over 2 hours and forced to pay a sizeable Duty Fee on donated Spanish Bibles that we give to the Orphanages. The story is explained further in the article to the left.



Heading back into the USA at the end of the day in Otay Mesa. Border wait times of one to two hours are the average experience. Occasionally, the time to cross can be a daunting three to four hour wait in an idling truck cab. All in a days work with a group of wonderful MCCA volunteers who are blessed by the Lord, abundantly, to be a blessing to the children.

Founded in 1964 in Redlands, CA., Mexican Christian Children's Aid is a, 501(c)(3), Charitable Organization. It began when a group of Christian business people were moved to address the sharp contrast between the affluence in the U.S., and the abject poverty found just across our southern border in Mexico. We purchase and provide monthly bulk food deliveries and other assistance to local Christian organizations in the northern Baja region. We deliver the food donations primarily to organizations that sponsor Children's Homes and or operate periodic Feeding Programs to needy families. Along with the food, Spanish translation Bibles, Gospel Tracts, and other items are generally a part of our deliveries. Our monthly runs consist of all volunteer drivers and riders who donate their vehicles full of fuel and literally everything needed to complete the mission each time we go. The MCCA does not own or rent a building, nor are there any paid staff.

The result is that 100% of all monetary donations goes directly to purchase food products.

#### Proverbs 16:9 - "A man's heart plans his way, but the LORD directs his steps."

The verse above has been special to me since I first read it many years ago. It has given me great comfort as I think about God's personal and watchful eye on our lives as Christians. I think He wants us to be active and to plan our ways, day by day. This verse is, at the same time, a wonderful promise to believers that, surrendering your life to Jesus Christ provides a light unto your path, through thick and thin, joys and sorrows, difficulties and successes. Through it all it is God who aims us in the direction that His perfect will desires for us go. Not always easy, but always what is best for us.

A good example of a person's steps being directed by God is our friend and fellow MCCA team member Tom Rasmussen. At our last MCCA Board Meeting on Monday, May 5th, our friend Tom was mentioned with admiration for all that he did to make our organization better during his years of involvement in our charity. In recent years, Tom has stepped back from the MCCA, but we thought it would be nice to mention him in this months newsletter as a way to say thanks for all he has done, and wish him and his wife blessings in retirement.

Case in point, consider Tom's path since back in 2007. At the time he was a successful and accomplished Medical Doctor / Anesthesiologist when, one day, he picked up a copy of the Press Enterprise Newspaper. An article about a local charity, the Mexican Christian Children's Aid, caught his eye. The article planted a seed of interest, and Tom made contact with Warren and Judy Arnett. Not long after that he joined Warren and Judy Arnett in their truck, heading for Tijuana, Mexico delivering food to needy children. God had shined a light on a path and Tom decided to proceed upon it. That obedience to God's gentle call blessed Tom's life along with many others for many years.

Most of us who have become involved with the MCCA will always remember our first few ride a longs. The experience tends to touch a person's heart profoundly. For many it's a "heart of stone turning to flesh" kind of thing as you visit the orphanages and homes for disabled kids. After only about 3 of the monthly trips with Warren and Judy, Tom began to consider purchasing a truck of his own, that he might contribute by being a driver. Eventually he bought a truck and became a very valuable member of the MCCA. A member of his family, Max Lowry rode along routinely.

Tom served faithfully as a driver, and eventually became a member of the Board of Directors. He was nominated to the Executive Board serving for approximately 5 years as Treasurer, a very time consuming job. He made thoughtful contributions and improvements to the MCCA such as, using an MCCA Credit Card instead of cash converted to Pesos to purchase the monthly food in Mexico. He produced GPS Coordinate charts for all of the stops we bring food to, saving many drivers from getting lost. He developed a system for sorting and packaging the Spanish Translation Bibles according to each individual route of travel. He developed load sheets used each month for each driver to simplify and help to insure accuracy.



Sincere thanks to you Tom for your quiet example of faith and humility, hard work on behalf of the MCCA, and your thoughtful contributions to the organization that have certainly been a path of blessing, from the Lord through you, to us all.
