

#### From Pastor Kamp's Desk

#### **PURE AND FAULTLESS**



"Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world." James 1:27

In the ancient world the orphans and widows were the most vulnerable individuals within a community. This was because it was a father or husband's responsibility to provide and protect their family. This was the social structure which the Roman world operated under. This means when a woman became a widow or a child an orphan there no longer was anyone socially responsible to care for or protect them. They had to fend for themselves in a society that did not offer much opportunity apart from servitude or becoming a slave.

This is one reason why the kinsman-redeemer laws in the Old Testament (Deuteronomy 25:5-10; Leviticus 25:47-55) were so significant. It is what makes the story of Ruth so beautiful as it shows in Boaz's willingness to become a kinsman-redeemer and take upon himself the religious responsibility to care for the widows Ruth and Naomi. The book of Ruth could be what James has in mind when he describes the "pure and faultless" religious life which the Father accepts.

Now an incredible development which immediately takes place within the church is that we see the needy people (Acts 4:32-35) and the widows (Acts 6:1) are being cared for to point that if they are ignored, they felt free to object to the Apostles. Already, there was an assumed responsibility shared within the church to protect and provide for their vulnerable members. Other scriptures, however, do not allow this responsibility to become an indefinite handout which can be abused, but rather seeks to help the vulnerable become stable and fruitful within the church and the wider world. (1 Timothy 5)

This practice of the early church created an alternative relief system to the surrounding culture which was not only more merciful but also honorable. Rather than establish subservient relationships which exploited the vulnerable for personal advantage; the church lived in familial relationships which were restorative through the practice of sacrificial love in a Christian community. The church did more than just provide for the financial needs; it also provides an identity of brother and sister and surrounded them with a caring community. The ability of the church to transform lives the Roman World used or ignored was one of its best witnesses to the power of God's gospel.

I have been reflecting upon this early church example because of the recent presentation by "Safe Families" which is an organization that works to link vulnerable families with strong Christian communities to keep children safe and help families flourish. They spoke with such passion of the power of the Christian Church to transform lives which no amount of welfare or money can match.

This mindset is reflected in the mission and ministry of Love, INC in Oskaloosa that seeks to show mercy through transformational Christian relationships. Both organizations seek to return the church to her first witness which was to live a pure and faultless religion which cared for the widow and orphan in a way that humanized and honored them.

And so, as we enter this fall time and a new school year, may God give us eyes to see those who are vulnerable and a heart to care for them so that we might live a life which pleases God.


#### Games Day


We would like to get a count on how many would be interested in coming to Games Day this year. We have a GREAT time playing dominoes and enjoying fellowship during coffee time.

#### Women's Thursday Morning Bible Study: Esther – Trusting God's Plan


**Who?** – Women of all ages ready to meaningfully engage with God's Word and each other are welcomed.




