From Pastor Spronk's Desk



CALL TO PRAYER IN 2026

Over the last several weeks, in the aftermath of the Multiply Conference, Pastor Erik and I have been talking to a lot of CRC people in Iowa and across the United States and Canada. Many of our conversations are looking ahead to 2026 as we, and many others, seek to guide a vision for the CRC in our Classis and Synod. I know I have said it a lot lately, but I am so excited for a renewed vision of revival in the CRC, and it sure seems like the Spirit is at work in our churches.

In the coming months, Pastor Erik and I are hoping to share more opportunities for our church to connect with other churches and leaders. But as the calendar turns to 2026, our first opportunity for revival and renewal will begin with an emphasis on Prayer. In our AM services this winter, we will focus on the Lord's Prayer as we look at the final section of the Heidelberg Catechism.

If we are going to see revival in the CRC, prayer will be primary reason. As the Catechism reminds us, "God gives his grace and Holy Spirit only to those who pray continually and groan inwardly, asking God for these gifts and thanking God for them (Q&A 116)," and "God will surely listen to our prayer because of Christ our Lord. That is what God promised us in his Word (Q&A 117)."

Furthermore, our CRC leaders in Thrive and Resonate are asking that our members "dedicate a weekly call to pray and fast for renewal in the CRC, for God to multiply disciples, leaders, and churches and renew our passion for church planting." After the Christmas break, I hope to have more information about how these weekly prayers will be distributed to the congregation, but please start now making this year a season of prayer in your personal, family and community worship practices.

To start, I'd invite you to pray this prayer in this new year:

Lord God, we pray that your Spirit may work powerfully in our church and our denomination in 2026. May you raise up disciples, leaders and churches. May we have renewed passion to seek the lost and to proclaim the gospel to the world.

May we together seek Jesus, the light of the world. In His Name, Amen.





Fall 2025

Dear Friends at First CRC,

Greetings in the name of Jesus, our Lord and Savior. We pray that this letter finds you and your church family well and filled with God's love and blessings.

Lake View Camp was blessed with a great summer, and we continue to praise God for all that we were able to accomplish through the sharing of God's Word and the Power of the Holy Spirit. We give Him thanks and praise for a great summer staff, for all of the campers who attended this summer, and for all of the volunteers who came out to give of their time and talents. We also praise God for our special partnerships with churches like you who help us bring the good news of God's love, salvation, and grace to His children both young and old.

Summer 2025 Theme - Stories from a Boat

"Jesus called them and immediately they left the boat and followed Him." Matthew 4:21B-22

"He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm." Mark 4:39-40

This past summer's campers were challenged by stories in the Bible that spoke about the importance of following Jesus and the deep faith required to do so. So many stories involve a boat in the Bible - Noah and the Ark, Jonah and the whale, Peter walking on water, the disciples and the storm, Jesus telling Peter and John and the other disciples to cast their nets on the other side of the boat, and so many more!

This summer was full of God's grace and goodness. With most of our church camps at full capacity, several weeks we needed to get creative to fit all in who were on a waitlist this summer. We really don't like turning away campers! Hundreds of campers - both new and returners - praising, worshiping, and learning about our God. We held 23 camps in 10 weeks this summer. 16 of those camps were church camps and 7 were Angel Tree Camps (camps for kids who have or have had a parent in prison).

We also keep busy during the "off season" with retreats, volunteer service days, work trips, and rental groups. We offered a Winter High School Retreat, Winter Middle School Retreat, and will be holding a Fall Middle School Retreat (which has filled up every bed and then some!). We held an Angel Tree Girls Retreat in the spring, and this fall will hold an Angel Tree Boys Retreat. We also partner with Central College Campus Ministries and hold two Elementary Angel Tree "Camp Fun Nights" during the school year. And this past spring, we took 29 youth and adults on a Spring Break Mission Trip to Cary, Mississippi. We will be well over 1,000 campers by the end of the year. Praise God!




PRAY FOR US!



She began to disobey her parents and cause trouble. She recalls, "I became a great burden to my parents and even to teachers in schools." Her parents were not believers, and she had never known about Jesus—until her school began using Bible League's materials in her classroom.

Through studying God's Word, Stacey understood she needed to change the way she was living and make better decisions. She beams, "While doing the booklet, I realized I needed to change by making the right decision of receiving Jesus."

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
God's Word Transforms Lives (continued)




Dear Friends,

For the last two months, the elementary students at Grace have been preparing for our first Christmas musical. Jeannie's Little Lamb kinder students will also take part!

The musical will be entirely in English. The title of the musical is "Sheep Stuff: A Wooly Awesome Christmas." The musical tells the Christmas story in a fun way that has really engaged the students!

The performance of the musical will be on December 23. Unfortunately, we will already be at our home in Texas on that date. We return to Texas each December to spend Christmas with our family.

We are also nearing the end of our school year. The school calendar in Korea is different from that in the United States. In Korea there is no long holiday season at the end of the calendar year. Most employers only give Christmas eve and Christmas day as vacation. That is because the more important new year's celebration is the Chinese lunar new year.


This year's lunar new year will be February 17. Many employers will give the whole week as vacation. The entire month of February is the most popular time in Korea for family vacations.

It is the lunar new year that makes the Korean school calendar so different from that of the U.S. or Canada. Our students will have December 24 and 25 as vacation. But they will return to school already on, Friday, December 26, for about a week of class! And then on January 1, they start a three-week January vacation.

Here's the odd part. Our students return to school from January 26 to February 6 to complete the 2025 (yes, the 2025!) school year. And then, the rest of February is vacation again! The 2026 school year begins in the first week of March.

Confused? We were also the first year we were here. But by now the rhythm has become a familiar one. Everything makes a little more sense once you realize that the real new year in Korea is the lunar new year. It wouldn't make sense to start the 2026 school year before the lunar new year!

We wish each of you a "woolly awesome Christmas." May you experience the awesome wonder of Immanuel – God with us.



Praise:

- This week Grace sponsored a workshop entitled: "Discipling the Next Generation: Is Sunday Enough?" The workshop brought together home school parents, churches with weekday after school tutoring programs, and Christian schools. Thank God for the enthusiastic attendance! We are praying that this will be the start of a Christian education network in Changwon.
- For promising early enrollment for the 2026 school year for both the elementary school and the Kinder.

Prayer:

- This is our 30th year of work with the mission agency of the Christian Reformed Church. (How time does fly!) Each year about one-third of our financial support comes during November and December. Pray with us for God's provision again this year.
- We are still in need of a first and second grade teacher for 2026. Please continue to pray for God's provision.

INVISIBLE


In many parts of the world, being disabled doesn't just mean the lack of mobility; it's a stigma that often relegates the person to shame and isolation. In these cultures, such treatment stems from.....

Superstition: In many communities, especially rural ones, disability is viewed as a curse, a punishment for wrongdoing by the person or his parents, or the result of witchcraft. This can cause families to hide or even abandon a disabled family member to avoid social stigma and shunning.

Dehumanization: Negative traditional beliefs lead some communities to see disabled people as "non-human," which can lead to neglect and abuse.

Diminished value: These misguided perceptions often frame disabled individuals as useless, incapable of contributing to their family or community. Worse, they are often a drain on their family's limited resources.

From now on, when you look at our



pictures of jubilant P.E.T. handcycle recipients, just imagine what a truly life-changing miracle this gift is for those "invisible ones." Many will attribute God as the giver of the gift, and rightly so. We who volunteer in making them, and you who support us, are privileged to be His instruments in making that happen.

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

Warren grew up in Long Beach, CA. and attended Wilson High School. He received his bachelor's degree from Chapman College. During that time, he met Judith Ann Tucker while participating in church choir in Long Beach.


With Judy attending the University of Redlands, Warren moved to Redlands and began working for the Redlands Unified School District. Warren also joined the United States Marine Corps during this time and was a reservist. He taught for 27 years coaching at Redlands High School before focusing on U.S. History and Physical Education at Moore Jr. High and finally Cope Jr. High School. Warren and Judy enjoyed over 62 years of marriage and had three sons, Mike, Jim, and Gary.

Warren was an Eagle Scout. He was also very involved in the YMCA as a youth and later managed YMCA camps in Barton Flats and Camp Round Meadow, for six summers in the early 1970's.

In 1984 Warren and Judy started Arnett Property Management which they ran for 25 years. This allowed them the freedom to travel and experience life (often on horse back). Annual trips included Lake Powell and riding in the mountains of Wyoming.

Warren answered the call to a life of service. He served supporting local youth sports with terms as President of Redlands Bench Warmers. He also served in the Optimist Club from the late 1960's until 2015. Finally, Judy and Warren served for 20 years in instrumental roles with their God given passion to support orphanages in Mexico through MCCA, delivering food and supplies monthly to the orphanages.

Warren was a cowboy who loved his parents, his siblings (Joyce and Don), his three sons, and his grandkids (Jake, Hailey, Kyle, and Alyssa. He will be dearly missed by everyone who knew him.


Founded in 1964 in Redlands, CA., Mexican Christian Children's Aid is a, 501(c)(3), Charitable Organization. It began when a group of Christian business people were moved to address the sharp contrast between the affluence in the U.S. and the abject poverty found just across our southern border in Mexico. We purchase and provide monthly bulk food deliveries and other assistance to local Christian organizations in the northern Baja region. We deliver the food donations primarily to organizations that sponsor Children's Homes and or operate periodic Feeding Programs to needy families. Along with the food, Spanish translation Bibles, Gospel Tracts, and other items are generally a part of our deliveries. Our monthly runs consist of all volunteer drivers and riders who donate their vehicles full of fuel and literally everything needed to complete the mission each time we go.

The MCCA does not own or rent a building, nor are there any paid staff.

The result is that 100% of all monetary donations goes directly to purchase food products.




